YEARBOOK THEME ASSIGNMENT

The theme is the first thing that students will notice about our yearbook. As such we will be having a competition to choose the best one for next year. You are to develop a theme that may be used throughout the yearbook. You can work alone or with a partner.

You need to brainstorm all possible theme ideas and find one theme you believe we should use. Theme Ideas can be found anywhere. Just google yearbook themes also Pinterest has some good ideas as well.

Remember that a theme has two components or parts: the verbal tagline (written words) and the visual presentation (how the theme looks through graphics, page design, color and fonts).

To test how strong your theme is, consider:

- Is your theme recognizable?
- Is your theme repeatable?
- Is your theme relevant (to the school/to the grads)?
- Is your theme refreshing?
- Is your theme realistic?

This project consists of the following parts:

PART 1: THE WRITTEN COMPONENT

Present a (1 page) typed times new roman 12 point font double spaced a description and explanation of:

- Your theme
- The parts (subtopics. Example how you will integrate this in the yearbook)
- The intended meaning
- How it is relevant to the school, year, and graduating class

PART 2: THE VISUAL COMPONENT

You are to submit a polished visual presentation outlining all of the parts of your proposal. You can present your ideas using digital media (ex PowerPoint) or use a FULL-SIZE display board with your examples printed out. (If you chose a ful- size display board you must print out color examples.) Make sure you label each component accurately and include the following:

- Cover and spine
- End Sheets(front & back)
- Title page
- Opening Spread (Letter/Index)
- Divider
- Student Life

- Sports
- Feature
- Activities
- Closing Spread

PART 3: THE PRESENTATION

You are being evaluated on your ability to clearly and concisely explain your theme and its verbal and visual components. ALL STUDENTS SHOULD BE PREPARED TO PRESENT ON THE FIRST DAY OF PRESENTATION AND ALL WORK SHOULD BE SUBMITTED ON THAT DAY. (THIS YEAR ALL PRESENTATIONS WILL BE DONE DIGITALLY. YOU CAN RECORD YOUR PRESENTATION AHEAD OF TIME OF YOU CHOOSE. BE AS CREATIVE AS YOU LIKE. MAKE SURE YOU WATCH THE KHAN ACADEMY UNIT ABOUT PITCHING AND FEEDBACK. THIS WILL HELP YOU TREMENDOUSLY WITH PUTTING YOUR PRESENTATIONS TOGETHER.
