PART Two

The Crucible Project

There are several very interesting characters in The Crucible. You are about to become one of those characters for this assignment.

There are three (3) parts to this exam:

1. The project, comparing and contrasting the film and the play of The Crucible.
2. There will be a multiple choice exam.
3. ***You are to select one of the projects listed below and follow the instructions for that particular assignment, making sure that you meet ALL of the criteria given. You are then to write a rough draft, have it edited by two people, make your revisions, and then type your final copy.**

Project Selections

1. Write a letter from Elizabeth Proctor to Abigail Williams explaining her suspicions.
2. Write a letter from Abigail Williams to John Proctor explaining her thoughts and feelings.
3. Write a letter from Reverend Hale to John Proctor explaining how he feels now that the trial is over.
4. Write a letter from Mary Warren to Elizabeth Proctor explaining why she should be afraid of Abigail.
5. Write a letter from John Proctor to Judge Danforth discrediting Abigail Williams.
6. Write a letter from Elizabeth Proctor to Judge Danforth justifying her husband's actions.
7. Choose a character not sited and write to another (must be approved by Mrs. Kiel first.)

The layout of your letter should contain:

Introduction – This tells the person you are writing why you are writing the letter.

Body - The body of your letter should contain three(3) paragraphs giving reasons and examples to support your purpose.

Conclusion – Your concluding paragraph should tell the reader of the letter what action, if any, you believe would be appropriate.

The grading rubric is as follows:

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| • Factual Content (making sure that information is historically correct as well as keeping true to the character) | 20% |
| • Grammar, Sentence Structure, Paragraph Structure, Spelling, etc - | 20 % |
| • Creativity/Making it look Authentic (Tea Staining, worn/burned edges, wax-sealing making it look scroll-like use of the language of the time, the 17 th Century, etc)- | 20% |
| • "Being" the character you choose to write as | 10 % |
| • Layout of letter (see bottom) | 10% |
| • Date of letter | 5% |
| • Greeting and closing (including signature) | 5% |
| • Rough Draft – edited & signed by another student and an adult) | <u>10%</u> |
